# **Annual Flu Vaccination**

As you may know, every year in the autumn, all children are offered the Annual Flu Vaccination, administered by the school health team via a nasal spray. Given the times that we are in with the reemergence of Covid19, the Department of Health is encouraging as large an uptake of the vaccination as possible. Please find **copied below** a statement from Professor Sir Michael McBride Chief Medical Officer about <u>"Preparing For The 2023/2024 Influenza Season".</u>

I am writing to again ask for your help in assisting the delivery of the annual influenza vaccine for children via a school based programme. Please pass on my thanks and gratitude to all the staff involved in schools for accommodating the visits by school nursing teams to deliver the seasonal flu vaccination programme last year. Despite the challenges faced with the ongoing Covid 19 pandemic, 70.6% of primary school children were vaccinated (72.7% in 2022/23) while vaccination uptake in secondary schools was 60.2% (63.8% in 2022/23). I wanted to re-emphasize the importance of the school based annual flu vaccination programme in helping to reduce the risk of concomitant circulation of influenza and Covid-19 during autumn and winter. The Joint Committee on Vaccinations and Immunisations (JCVI), an independent expert advisory body, advises that the childhood flu vaccination programme is the best way to reduce influenza transmission and provide protection to the wider population. I can confirm that in addition to primary school children, all pupils in school years 8 to 12 will again to be eligible for an influenza vaccination this year. Therefore, school health teams will again seek parental/guardian approval to vaccinate all children (including those in a clinical risk group) attending primary school, special school and years 8-12 of secondary school during the 2023/24 academic year i.e., those born between 2 July 2007 to 1 July 2019.

The School Health Team will be visiting Harding Memorial Integrated Primary School on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> October 2023 for the School Influenza Vaccine Programme. The programme has been introduced to give protection to children against flu, which can be a very unpleasant illness and can mean that they have to take time off school. It will also help to stop the spread of flu and so will protect people around them as well.

# Parents and School in Partnership

- Please make sure that all pupil equipment and clothing is clearly labelled. We would encourage parents to recheck their child's school uniform and if necessary re-mark any unidentified items. If anything is misplaced by your child at school, please make sure your child has told their Class Teacher or the School Building Supervisor, Mrs Lyttle, and we will then attempt to resolve the situation.
- We would request that all Parent/Guardians ensure that the contact details that parents provide as part of the school annual data collection are accurate. All contact information has been processed to date. <u>Any changes to addresses, email addresses or emergency contact numbers</u> <u>must be supplied via email to the school office.</u> Failure to do so can cause significant problems in an emergency situation. In particular, we would urgently request that all parents <u>should</u> <u>ensure that all their mobile contact phone numbers are accurate and also that your mobile</u> <u>phone has an answer machine message facility in order for school to make contact.</u>
- We will send a test text message to all Priority 1 mobile numbers on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> October to make sure that everyone is able to receive these urgent messages. If you have parental responsibility and are the first point of contact and DO NOT receive a text on that day please email the school office on info@hardingmemorial.belfast.ni.sch.uk with your updated telephone number. ONLY one parent is set as Priority 1
- We would request that all pupils from P1 to P7 have access to a suitable outdoor coat (with hood) in school, especially if they have travelled to school by car. We would prefer pupils not to use umbrellas in the school playground due to the possibility of a child being accidently hurt by a child losing control of their umbrella. It may be particularly useful for older pupils to leave an "emergency coat" in school.
- At Harding Memorial Integrated Primary School we acknowledge that the whole area of "Child Protection" is a sensitive and difficult issue. The relationships which School Staff have with children and parents are often based on trust and confidentiality. Such relationships are acknowledged as underpinning the secure, caring environment for growth and learning which schools seek to provide for their pupils. However, all individuals connected to our School must recognise that, in order to protect children from abuse, neglect and exploitation, a proper balance must be struck between protecting children and respecting the rights and needs of parents and families. As part of the Home/School partnership all Stakeholders are reminded that it is accepted School Policy that any Harding Memorial Pupil (whilst they are in the vicinity of the school grounds) **should not be approached by any adult other than their own Parent/Guardian or a member of Harding Memorial Integrated Primary School Staff.** If you have any questions about any aspect of School Safeguarding/Child Protection please speak to the Designated Teacher for Child Protection (Mrr Cumper) or Deputy Designated Teacher for Child Protection (Mrs Baird)

# How Do I Make Contact With School ?

- If a Parent/Guardian has a concern regarding their child this should be brought to the Class Teacher first. For the smooth operation of the school if a Parent/Guardian requires an extended conversation about an incident/event, an appointment should be made with the class teacher either through the school secretary or by letter. The issues should be clarified to enable the Class Teacher to make appropriate preparation.
- If the issue is not resolved a meeting with the Principal may be arranged. If it is necessary to discuss something with a Teacher, then a note should be written or a phone call made to arrange a mutually convenient time. Class Teachers may be available at the beginning and end of the school day to speak briefly to parents but please note that every Teacher has Curriculum commitments both before and at the end of the normal school day.

# School Security

We are very keen to promote a Healthy Lifestyle amongst our pupils and encourage children walking cycling or scooting to School. <u>However, we would strongly encourage all</u> <u>Parent/Guardians to ensure that their child's bicycle or scooter is locked in place during the school day.</u> Whilst School will prioritise the safety and security of our pupils within the school building, we are aware that there are certain vulnerabilities with items left outside of school e.g. bicycles and scooters. <u>In addition, we strongly recommend that all children wear cycle helmets.</u>

# **Positive Behaviour Scheme - Harding Hero for Friendship**

The "Harding Hero" Scheme is used to reinforce and promote Positive Behaviour amongst all the pupils at our school. The aim of this scheme is to create an atmosphere in which the pupils are encouraged to develop a sense of self-esteem and an awareness of the needs of others. At the end of each behaviour theme period a pupil from Primary 1 to Primary 7 will receive a behaviour certificate which will be displayed on the Harding Hero Noticeboard. The theme for the current Harding Hero Scheme is **Friendship** which we can by demonstrated by **listening to each other, by taking turns, by trusting each other and by sorting out conflicts sensibly.** We hope that all parents will assist us in the project by reinforcing the importance of children demonstrating **Friendship** both inside and outside out of school.
