It was wonderful to see our Primary 1, Primary 2 and Primary 3 pupils return to school today for Face to Face Teaching for the first time since the end of the First Term at Harding Memorial Primary School. The Northern Ireland Executive have announced the roadmap that will take us out of lockdown. Whilst it didn't provide dates many would have hoped for, we can at least begin to make plans and estimate timescales based on the criteria identified for when all children will return. Unfortunately P4 to P7 pupils are not permitted to return under the current restrictions. I am hopeful that this will be immediately after Easter but this won't be confirmed by the Executive until the next checkpoint in the middle of March. I am also hopeful that a decision will be made at this time that will allow P1-P3 pupils to remain in school right up to Easter and return after Easter. I would just like to say once again that we really appreciate the hard work and effort that you as Parent/Guardians are putting in to help support the children at this time. It is an incredibly challenging time for us all and I would like to express my thanks to all School Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff for their continual hard work and dedication.

Primary 1 to Primary 3 Class Teachers have been planning a variety of educational activities to welcome our children back to school in a positive way after their period of Home/Remote Learning. We will also be taking them outdoors weather permitting for regular breaks and playtime so please ensure that your Child brings warm and waterproof coats to school.

Maintaining safety is everyone's responsibility. Each of us has a part to play and all Adults, Staff and Parents, Grandparents, Child Minders etc. need to fully co-operate with social distancing, and wearing face coverings on school grounds. It is widely recognised that it is socialisation around Primary Schools by adults and socialisation around Post Primary schools by the pupils themselves on transport etc. that has the potential to cause a rise in transmission rates again. If everyone in our school plays their part we can ensure this does not happen at Harding Memorial Primary School



- Please wash hands regularly
- Please wear face coverings in school grounds (unless you are exempt)
- Please make space for each other and maintain social distancing of 2m from other adults

- The Harding Memorial Primary School building is closed to all visitors except our Children, Staff and Essential Visiting Workers.
- All School Parent/Guardians will be actively discouraged from entering our School Building as a means of preventing spread of the virus.
