Dear Parent/Guardian

This year celebrations and learning will be based around the theme: "Too good to be true? Keeping yourself and others safe from scams online".

Clearly the Internet is a unique and exciting resource that can bring the world into the classroom by giving children access to a global network of educational resources. Indeed, the Internet has been described as being like a "vast city" with an exciting variety of places to visit; with entertainment areas, educational areas and people to meet. But there are undoubtedly areas that we certainly would not want Primary School Aged Children to visit.

The digital world of social media is a fast changing landscape with new applications and social networks multiplying. As a parent, you will want to ensure that your child is safe and that you are well enough informed to support their use of any digital appliances. Therefore, we felt it would be very beneficial for all of our children to follow these "SMART TIPS"

Secret - Always keep your name, address, mobile phone number and password private – it's like giving out the keys to your home!



**Meeting** someone you have contacted in cyberspace can be dangerous. You **must only do so with your parent's/carer's permission**, and then only when they can be present.



**Accepting** e-mails or opening files from people you don't really know or trust can get you into trouble – they may contain viruses or nasty messages.



Reliable- Someone on-line may be lying and not be who they say they are. Stick to the public areas in chat rooms and if you feel uncomfortable, simply get out of there!



**Tell** your parent or carer if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried.

## Facebook/WhatsApp/Snapchat and Other Social Networking Sites Guidance

### Why have we included this information in this letter?

Although the terms and conditions of using Facebook/WhatsApp/Snapchat state that the **user** *must* be older that 11 years of age e.g in Secondary School we know that there are some children within Harding Memorial Integrated Primary School who are using such social media networking sites. However, if a child at Harding Memorial Integrated Primary School has this type of Social Media Account then they have already broken the terms of the site as they must have uploaded false information about their age. At Harding Memorial Integrated Primary School we do not condone the use of any other social networking site by any of our Primary School Pupils. In HMIPS all part of the School Pastoral Care policy we will continue to inform parent/guardian of any issues that we become aware of in school with regard to the inappropriate use of social networking sites.

## What can parents do to help?

## Firstly, Primary-Age children should not be on these sites.

However, if you wish for your child/children to use this technology we <u>would strongly urge every</u> <u>parent/guardian to talk to their child/children about their use of the internet.</u>

For example, please check with your child/children:

- What are they posting online?
- ❖ Who can see it?
- ❖ Are they sharing their age, address, e-mail or phone number on Facebook?
- Are they inappropriately asking to become friends with teachers and other staff members? We as a school do not permit any form of ICT or modern communication technologies (e-mail, texting, Facebooking or the use of any other social networking site) to be used as a means of communication about school matters between staff and pupils or staff and parents.
- ❖ For primary aged children it is more appropriate to use a cartoon photo as their personal photo than an actual photo
- ❖ It is important to help your child to understand that they should not post any photo they would not wish their mum, dad or granny to see. They should also understand that even if they are careful about privacy settings their electronic 'friends' might not be (and that means that others can 'take' or 'harvest' photos from their web space if they are not stored privately).

### A Final Point To Remember:

Many people do share information online without thinking about the possible consequences! Once information is shared online, it is very hard (often impossible) to remove. The following link may also be helpful in deciding how to pitch your safe talk with your child(ren):

We would like to remind all Parent/Guardians of our organisational arrangements for Emergency School Closure Situations. **We have a system in school to enable us to text parents to inform them if school is closed for any emergency situation.** In the case of extreme weather conditions, any decision whether or not to close the school will be taken as early as possible. Parent/Guardians were notified about the School Closure on Friday 24th January 2025 as soon as the School had received Formal Closure Notification from the Education Authority. In the event of disruption caused by inclement weather such as heavy snow our prime concern must always be the safety of the pupils and staff. We will also endeavour to list any School Closure Information on the BBC News N.I. Website or the School Website

- If you do not receive any closure information from the school, please assume that "Harding Memorial Integrated Primary School is "Open As Usual" for all Primary 1 to Primary 7 Pupils.
- If anyone received a new phone for Christmas and has changed their number, please ensure that you let the School Office have the number immediately, in case we need to contact you urgently. This is particularly important during the cold weather as in the event of the school being closed due to bad weather we will use text message numbers.
- Finally, can you please ensure that all Adult Contact Mobile Phones have the **Answer Machine Facility** in operation to enable school to leave a Phone Message in an Emergency.
